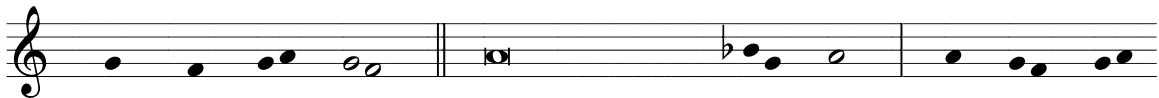

And our despoilers urged us to be joy- ous: “Sing for us the songs of

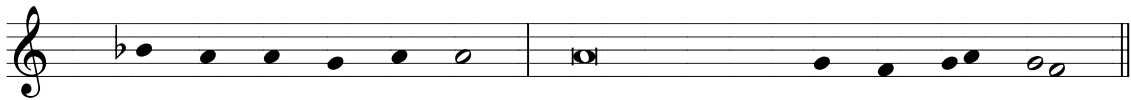
