The disease of dropsy is named from the watery fluid which characterises it. The word is derived from the Greek for water. The disease consists of an accumulation of fluid under the skin, arising from a fault in the bladder; there is also swelling and bad breath. It is peculiar to the disease that the more the patient accumulates this unwanted fluid, the more thirsty he becomes. If there are 27, the twenty-fourth will be the Fourth after Epiphany, the twenty-fifth will be the Fifth after Epiphany, and the twenty-sixth will be the Sixth after Epiphany.

If there are 28, the twenty-fourth will be the Third after Epiphany, the twenty-fifth will be the Fourth after Epiphany, the twenty-sixth will be the Fifth after Epiphany, and the twenty-seventh will be the Sixth after Epiphany.
