Ticklish Mediants: sol non u-ret te. pro-pi-ti- á-ti- o est. Qui fa-cit haec.

Ticklish Endings: loquébar pacem de te. lu-cí-fe-rum génu- i te. in saécu-lum saécu-li. et exaudívit me. *

Gradual & Alleluia Verse

(Ps 16: 8, 2) Keep me, Lord, as the apple of thine eye, shelter me in the shadow of thy wings.

Vs. May my vindication come from thee, may thine eyes see the right.
