Your Eminence:

I am writing to the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith to clarify the use of chant for the prayers and blessings found in the Nuptial Mass of the 1962 Missale Romanum. Various ritual books published before Trent and afterwards include chant notation for the Nuptial Blessing, suggesting that the blessing (along with the other prayers particular to a Nuptial Mass) could be sung rather than recited on more solemn occasions. The Ordinary Form also makes this provision, such as in the 2016 edition of the Order of Celebrating Matrimony. However, the 1962 Missale Romanum, the 1957 Rituale Romanum, and the 1962 Parish Ritual are all silent on the question. Thus I ask, assuming all the requirements for imparting the Nuptial Blessing are met:

Is it permitted to sing the Nuptial Blessing (Deus, qui potestate virtutis) and accompanying prayers (such as Propitiare Domine supplicationibus nostris and Deus Abraham, Deus Isaac, etc.) during a sung Mass offered for a newly-married couple in the Extraordinary Form?
