Office on the dedication of a Church and on its Anniversary

The feast of the Dedication of a Church is a feast of the Lord. On the actual day of the dedication of a church the Office of the occurring liturgical day is said up to None inclusive. If possible a Vigil should be made before the relics of the saints which are to be placed in the altar of the church about to be consecrated. The three nocturns of the Matins of the martyrs whose relics are to be enclosed should be sung or chanted. The faithful also should be invited to take part in this Vigil.

Those bound by the obligation of the Divine Office satisfy their obligation for Matins by the recitation of the nocturns in honour of the holy martyrs during

the Vigil.

The Office of the Dedication is begun at Vespers on the actual day of dedication and said right through the following day to Compline as on a I class feast.



n the feast of a virgin the theme should be virginity; this is our theme in to-day's sermon. May Christ the virgin's son and the spouse of virgins come to our aid. He was born according to the flesh from a virginal womb, and wedded according to the spirit in virginal nuptials. Since, therefore, the whole church is a virgin, as the Apostle says, ought they not be honoured highly who even in the body itself preserve those virtues which the church, as a whole, keeps in faith? No corporal fertility, then, is comparable to holy virginity even though this, too, be corporal.

The Office of the Dead

It is usually said in choir on the day of burial. It is furthermore to be recited chorally on the four Anniversaries of the Order. Those absent from choir must still say it within the respective week, though they are permitted to say it in parts. It is to be noted that an Anniversary of the Order should be celebrated on the day laid down in the calendar unless it falls on a liturgical day of the I or II class: in which case the Anniversary is transferred to the nearest day not similarly impeded.

At the Our Father and at the prayer ending Lauds and Vespers, a genuflexion is made, depending on whether in the canonical Hour immediately preceding genuflexions were made or not.



He should exhort him to offer himself to God as ready to accept whatever might be the divine will, and, even to undergo death itself with resignation as a satisfaction for the penalties deserved by sin.

Then the priest should console him with loving words and raise up hope that out of the divine bounty he will receive remission of temporal punishment and gain eternal life.
