

The Gradual ("Converte Domine Aliquantulum") is the same one used for "Sabbato Quatuor Temporum Quadragesimæ" which means "Ember Saturday of Lent." The 1962 *Missale Romanum* seems to have added an optional "short form" for the Ember Days, which formerly had multiple collects, epistles, and graduals.
