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
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## GLORIA — ORGAN ACCOMPANIMENT


These opening measures are an “*ossia*”—that is, a different harmonization which may be chosen at will. The piece continues —“we adore you”—at the large asterisk (see below).

Reminder: Whenever possible, the celebrant alone intones the “Glory to God.”


