In Paschal-time the Mass Sancti tui, page 1333, is said in place of this Mass, but with the Prayer, Secret and Postcommunion of this Mass.

**Introit. Ps. 33, 20, 1**

**Q**UANTUM tribulationes iustorum, et de his omnibus liberavit eos Dominus:

Dominus custodit omnia ossa eorum: unum ex his non conteretur. Ps. 33, 2. Benedicam Dominum in omni tempore: semper laus ejus in ore meo. *V. Glória.*

**Q**UANTUM are the afflictions of the just, and out of all these the Lord hath delivered them: the Lord keepeth all their bones: not one of them shall be broken. Ps. 33, 2. I will bless the Lord at all times: His praise shall be always in my mouth. *V. Gory.*
